What is Wider Opportunities?

The Wider Opportunities programme brings together the expertise of music specialists and the class teacher in a team teaching situation which enables a whole-class of children to experience the delights of learning to play a musical instrument for a period of one year. This opportunity is free for children and may form their curriculum entitlement for that year. Very often the class teacher learns along side the children - an excellent opportunity for 'on the job' professional development.

Since September 2011 over 90% of Wigan primary schools have enabled their pupils to learn to play a musical instrument free of charge for one year through the Wider Opportunities Programme.

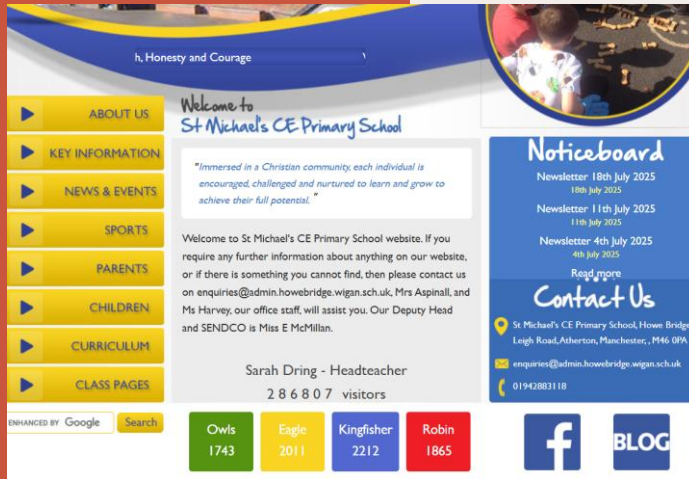
